### From the Pastor's Heart

#### *"Peace, Peace, Wonderful Peace"*

When I look back on my teenage years, the season that most tried my faith wasn't a tragic loss or a deep betrayal by the world. It was a church split.

Now, for those who didn't grow up in the world of independent Baptist churches, a church split might sound foreign. Imagine a close-knit family feud that escalates past reconciliation—accusations whispered, alliances drawn, hearts broken, and people packing up their pews and leaving, never to return. That's a church split. And more often than not, it doesn't look anything like Jesus.

My grandfather had planted Landmark Baptist Church, and for much of my childhood, it was the center of our family and faith. He wasn't just the pastor—he was the spiritual patriarch of the congregation and of our family. But in May of 1999, my grandfather passed away, and with his passing came a void—a vacancy in the pulpit that would reveal cracks in our foundation no one knew were there.

His longtime assistant, Brother Dennis, stepped in as the interim pastor. It seemed like the natural move, but for reasons I still don't fully understand, the church never called him as senior pastor. Instead, a parade of guest preachers began—a spiritual audition of sorts. There were whispers and wonderings, even hopes. Would they call Uncle Brad, married to my Aunt Lee Ann? Would the soft-spoken and gentle Michigan pastor return?

In the end, the search committee offered the position to another uncle of mine—Mark Landolt. Tall, thin, intellectual, and intense, Uncle Mark was a former missionary with years of experience in East Germany and Romania. I looked up to him. He felt like a spiritual giant. At first, things seemed to go well. New people came. Salvations happened. Guest preachers with global experience came and went. I was a teenager, dreaming of doing big things for God, and for a while, it felt like the momentum of revival was catching wind. Then came Christmas Eve.

Landmark didn't typically hold special Christmas Eve services, but if it fell on a Wednesday, we'd still have church. That particular night, the crowd was small, the sanctuary dim, and Uncle Mark stepped into the pulpit with a sternness that caught us off guard. He scolded the congregation—his voice hard, his words sharp. I remember feeling confused and uneasy.

And then my father stood up.

From halfway back on the right side, my dad's voice cut through the sanctuary: "Brother Mark! It's Christmas Eve. Don't you think you've fleeced us enough? Maybe you could try feeding us for a change."

Time slowed. I was sitting up front to the left. I turned around, heart pounding. Did that really just happen?

In our church culture, pastors weren't just leaders. They were spiritual monarchs—challenging them publicly was unthinkable.

But my dad, who I've come to understand more with each passing year, wasn't trying to disrespect. He was doing what so few had the courage to do—speak truth when the sheep were being wounded by the shepherd.

Not long after, the church leadership asked Uncle Mark to step down. But not all agreed. The deacon board split—two for, two against. The church split too. Anonymous letters, harsh accusations, whispered rumors—all of it followed.

Eventually, Brother John Allen became the new pastor. He was a man of quiet strength—an Army veteran who had faithfully served at Landmark for years, cleaning toilets, serving quietly, loving deeply. But even his appointment brought division. Some left again. Some letters resurfaced. Peace felt impossible.

And our family? Torn in two. My dad's stand had placed us on one side. Uncle Mark and his family were on the other. I wasn't allowed to see my cousins. And that—that—was what broke me the most. The church hurt. The confusion. The betrayal. I could handle all of that. But not the loss of my family.

I spiraled. In my foolish teenage heart, I resented my father. I resented the church. I resented the school. I fantasized about running away and living with my cousins. I didn't yet understand that my dad—wise, discerning, painfully obedient—saw things I couldn't. Things I didn't want to see.

In that darkness, I began to cry out to God. I found an old journal recently from that time, pages filled with teenage prayers begging for peace, for reconciliation, for healing.

And in the midst of my ache, I found a song—an old hymn that wrapped itself around my heart like a warm blanket:

*Far away in the depths of my spirit tonight, rolls a melody sweeter than psalm;*

*In celestial-like strains it unceasingly falls*

*O'er my soul like an infinite calm.*

*Peace, peace! wonderful peace,*

*Coming down from the Father above,*

*Sweep over my spirit forever,*

*I pray, In fathomless billows of love.*

That hymn became my anthem. And though I couldn't see the full picture then, I know now that God never left me in the storm. He was working behind the scenes, stitching together what felt hopelessly unraveled.

My family did reconcile—at least most of us. Uncle Mark remained apart, but that's a story for another day.

The church? Still standing. Still preaching Christ. Still growing. God had a plan. And I've found peace.

Peace not in the absence of storms, but in the presence of a Savior who holds all things—churches, families, and teenage hearts—in His hands.
