The Meek Giant

This week has been a flood of unexpected grace. As I write on Friday, September 19, the EA Convocation hasn't even begun, and already my heart is full to the brim.

Thanks to Salem's generosity and the support of the elders and congregation, I left for Convocation early and made my way to Dallas for The Art of Leadership Live. They capped attendance at 200 pastors—small enough that it felt like a circle of friends, even among strangers. We sat in tables of eight, grouped by church size and years of experience.

On the first evening, Carey Nieuwhof, the host, stood before us—not with polished strategies or easy answers, but with raw honesty. He spoke about the struggles of the past eighteen months in his own life and then left us with a piercing question: "How are you really doing?" That night in our hotel room, Darren Rowles and I wrestled with the question ourselves. We spoke honestly. We named stressors. We confessed. There was healing in simply telling the truth.

Later in the week came a session on revival. The speaker reminded us that revival never arrives without repentance. And then we did the unthinkable: we confessed sin publicly. The room of pastors fell into holy silence, broken only by trembling voices. It was powerful, humbling, cleansing.

When the conference ended, I drove south to Spring, just outside Houston, to stay with my cousin Heather and her husband Dave. We shared dinner around their table, swapped stories, laughed about family, and enjoyed the simple joy of being together.

This morning, before the sun came up, I packed my bags for the pastor's retreat in Needville. Dave and Heather rose early to make me breakfast and send me off. As I stood by the door, Heather stepped behind me, placed her small hand on my shoulder, and began to pray. Barely five feet tall, she became a giant in that moment. Her words thundered with conviction and tenderness—interceding for my marriage, my children, my ministry, my soul. When she finished, Dave added his own prayer, steady and affirming. Then I returned the gift, blessing them and their home.

But before I could leave, something unexpected happened. Heather wrapped her arms around me and began speaking blessings over my life—words of affirmation that poured like living water. For a minute that felt frozen in time, it was as though God Himself was whispering through her. I will never forget it.

October 5*World Communion Sunday: Sermon 2: Sola Gratia – Grace Alone

Text: Ephesians 2:1–9 / Title: Amazing Grace: God's Gift, Not Our Gain

Big Idea: Salvation is entirely by God's grace—it is not earned, but given freely to the undeserving.

Focus: The hopelessness of sin and the richness of God's mercy.

Big Idea: We are justified before God through faith—not works—so that no one can boast.
